## <sup>3</sup> MESSAGE FROM THE TREASURER:

Gentlemen and Brethren.



Last month, Brother Tomlin was kind enough to reflect on the gratitude he has for the Brethren who take leadership roles in teaching and mentoring. This month, I would like to echo that sentiment, and thank him for his dedication to the Lodge as well.

I was raised a Master Mason in 2015. When I joined, I was fortunate enough to have had two Brethren vouch for me, having not known anyone in the Lodge. Since then, Masonry has become more than I can possibly encapsulate in the limited time and space I have in this brief writing. Nonetheless, I shall endeavor to at least offer a whisper of its importance in hopes that my words may meet some ready ear and offer an idea of how Masonry helps me to understand, and to balance, the two worlds in terms of body (the objective world) and spirit (the subjective world).

We have all heard that Masonry is a system of morality veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbolism, which of course is as concise and accurate as anyone has ever put it. To me, though, I have found it to be even broader in scope than this definition.

Whether you dive into the Lectures or reflect on the Ritual floor work, not only moral philosophy (relation of Self to the Good) can be found, but you can discover metaphysics (study of reality), epistemology (study of knowledge), politics (study of Self to the group), and even aesthetics (study of beauty). It's simply a matter of searching, asking questions, and being open to what Masonry teaches that brings to light these secrets. I'll try to briefly explain what I mean with a simple article with which we are all familiar.

Take the use of the Hoodwink in Ritual. How might a Hoodwink help me understand life?

The Hoodwink, to me, speaks to metaphysical truth, a truth about reality. It teaches us that as we amble through life, even with the aid of guidance, we are blind in the flow of experience. Those things that are the dark side of life - fear, ignorance, resentment, etc. - are at every turn. Without the Light of intellectual and spiritual understanding, we remain in their darkness, or, at minimum, prone to submit to them in trying times. In life, it's those with a healthy and proper mindset that constructively reflect on life's experiences. It's only when we are removed from events by the fullness of time, when emotion has dimmed, fear has fled, frustrations have waned, that we see the events for what they were to us.

Such as it is in the Lodge, it's only when the journey (circumambulation) is over, and if we have been well-guided (by our Brother Deacon), that the veil is lifted (hoodwink removed) and we can look back and understand the events as they occurred to us (Lecture). And when the Hoodwink is lifted, we see the representations of the only things (the Great and Lesser Lights) that allow us to gain that proper and healthy understanding, if indeed we have kept them at the center of our journey, as they are in the Ritual.

Moreover, the Hoodwink speaks to epistemology, or at least what epistemology should be. Masonry seems, to me, to comprehend what the Neo-Atheists (or the masses for that matter) don't, to wit: that wisdom is the highest rung of the cognitive hierarchy, not knowledge; that the bridge between knowledge and understanding is experience; and that faith should have never been considered a means of acquiring knowledge (and therefore ridiculed by the profane), because it doesn't belong in that hierarchy at all. Rather, faith is the acceptance of inevitable limitations of our rude and imperfect state by nature. It is the tool that begins where epistemology ends and ethics begins. It is the lifeblood of the hope of redemption. The Hoodwink represents all of this. It forces the Candidate, without his volition, to embark on his journey blind, trusting only that which he cannot see, placing his hope beyond his cognitive faculties, that he may arrive at a place where he will finally understand in fullness, and live peacefully in the quiet repose of having gained the ability to 'let go.'

As I said, Masonry is a profound and complex Craft, and I apologize if this brief communication has been poorly or ineffectually articulated.

These types of truths can be garnered in every aspect of Masonry: in the movements of the floor work, the emblems, the symbols, the jewels, in everything. It is comprehensive, and it is personal. Most of all, Masonry helps me, personally, live life in the way I aspire to... meaningfully and purposefully.

At any rate, I appreciate all of you, and I appreciate being a part of Ashland Lodge No. 168. I'm proud to be a Brother among you, and I look forward to having these kinds of conversations about Masonry with anyone who's willing.


## WHAT YOU MISSED IN FEBRUARY:
